Curriculum <u>Design</u>

Teaching Resources

The Yu Dagang Memorial Scholarship is awarded to five students each academic year, with each recipient receiving 2,000 NT dollars.

The Liao Ping-Chang Mr. Impoverished Students' Scholarship is granted to three students each academic year, with each awardee receiving 30,000 NT dollars.

The Liu Dazhong Memorial Scholarship is awarded to one student each academic year, with the recipient receiving 30,000 NT dollars.

The Huakang Scholarship is awarded to the top three students in each grade every semester. The first-place winner receives 8,000 NT dollars, the second-place winner receives 5,000 NT dollars, and the third-place winner receives 2,000 NT dollars.
